In the matter of a road
Road Petitioned for by
H. F. Hanselman and 27 others

On the 3rd day of Jan'y 1891. a road
petition signed by H. F. Hanselman and 27 others was filed and
this day presented to the Board of County Commissioners
of Douglas County Kansas.

Praying for the Location and
Vacation of a certain road, as follows.

Locate! That part of Road No. 55, running on the East
line of the S. E. 1/4 of Sec. 25. T2S. R18. Kanwaka Township.
The object being to place said road on the Section line
It being demonstrated that, that would make a better road
and be for the accommodation of all the travel on said road
the same being now opened. No claim for damage will
be made.

Vacate! That part of said road not on
the aforesaid Sec. line in said 1/4 Sec.

Said petition was accompanied with a bond signed by H. F. Hanselman
as principal and M. B. Ray as surety in the full amount of all
costs and expenses accruing on the view, survey, and laying out of
said road. in case the prayer of said petitioners be not granted.
Whereupon said bond was approved by the Board, and it appearing
to the satisfaction of the Board that the law had been substantially
complied with it was Ordered that A. L. Derby, R. L. Patton and W. C. Porter
be appointed as viewers of said proposed road, and that they meet in
conjunction with the County Surveyor at the place of beginning in
Kanwaka Township, on the day designated in their notice over
