The aforesaid Anthony Gates a Sander sent a written communication to the Trustees of Palmyra Township in which he makes certain charges and complaints against the Supt and Matron of the County Asylum. said communication and a letter from B. D. Dickinson, Trustee, was presented to the Board.

Mr. D. Stall, Supt of County Asylum. having appeared before the Board as per request made the following statement to wit.

Anthony Gates, ^{first} came to the Asylum about 8 o'clock at night, he was offered supper, but said did not need any, was given a room and bed which he occupied during his stay. He was provided with good healthful food, the same as my own people use, and all that he wanted to eat. He left the Asylum on his own accord without any appearance cause. I did forbid him spitting tobacco juice on floor and walls of his room as he was provided with a box and bucket for said purpose.

I think his mind is unbalanced at times, and that he will not remain contented at any place for any length of time.

The Board took the aforesaid matter under advisement.
