In the matter of a
 Road petitioned for
 by S. C. Thacher

On the 11th day of April A.D. 1891. a Road
 petition signed by S. C. Thacher and 35 others was filed
 and this day presented to the Board of County Commissioners of
 Douglas County Kansas. Praying for the Relocation of a
 certain road described as follows.

Beginning at the North east corner of the Southwest $\frac{1}{4}$ of Sec. 16.
 N. 13. E. 19. Thence westerly along the North line of said $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. about
 80 rods. Thence south to the bridge crossing the Wakarusa Creek
 and locate the said road on the bank of Wakarusa Creek on
 the most practicable ground between the two points above
 mentioned. All of said located and relaid road being over
 the land of the principal petitioner S. C. Thacher.
 Said petition was accompanied with a bond as required by
 law signed by S. C. Thacher as principal and W. E. Suckin as
 surety in the sum of all expenses and costs accruing on view.
 Whereupon said bond was approved by the Board and it
 appearing to the satisfaction of the Board that the law had
 been substantially complied with. It was "Ordered" by the
 Board that Wm. Brown, Wm. C. Hutchfield and George Garage
 be appointed viewers on the proposed relocation of said
 road and that they meet in conjunction with the County
 Surveyor at the place of beginning on the day designated in
 their notice and proceed to view and lay out said road according
 to law, giving to all parties a hearing and make due report
 of their proceedings to the County Board.
