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and it appearing to the satisfaction of the Board that the law had been substantially complied with.

It was Ordered that George Miller, Dexter Tucker and Theodore Brown be appointed viewers of the proposed road, and that they meet in conjunction with the County Surveyor at the place of beginning, on the day designated in their notice and proceed to view and lay out said road according to law, giving to all parties a hearing and make due report of their proceedings to the County Board.

On the 14th day of April A.D. 1891 a road petition signed by F. P. Taughn and 51 others, was filed and this day presented to the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County Kansas, praying for the "Location" of a certain road described as follows, to wit:

Commencing about 35 rods directly North of the $\frac{1}{2}$ Sec Cor. on the north line of Sec 34, T4. R 20, running south on or near the middle of Sec 34, as near as may be on the $\frac{1}{2}$ Sec line. Thence about 80 rods to the unvacated portion of Main St. as laid down on the map of old Culmyra town site vacated.

Said line will accommodate all the main travel, and many interested in wood lands east. And will not interfere with farming operations.

If the northern part is thought to be impracticable cut off down to 66 rods south of $\frac{1}{2}$ Sec Cor. named.

Said petition was accompanied with a bond as required by law, signed by F. P. Taughn as Principal and F. D. Barrishlow surety in the sum of all expenses and costs accruing on view.

Whereupon said Bond was approved by the Board. And it appearing to the satisfaction of the Board that the law had been substantially complied with. It was Ordered by the Board that George Miller, Dexter Tucker and Theodore Brown be appointed viewers of the proposed road.
