work of D.C.

The Hon. Mayor of City of Lawrence and J.F. Wilder Comtee on City property, appeared before the Board and presented Resolutions as passed by the City Council relative to the working of the City and County Prisoners, and constructing a stockade for same. In part, as follows.

Resolution.

Resolved. That the County Commissioners are hereby granted the right and privilege to use so much of Vermont Street, North of Pinkney Street as may be necessary for the purpose above named. It being understood that the City shall furnish the stone and that it shall pay to the County the sum of fifty cents per cubic yard - for breaking the same - Provided, that the City Prisoners be allowed to work in said yard and that for the stone broken by such prisoners, there shall be no charge. Also considered.

Resolution. relative to the construction of a side walk on the East side of the Kansas River Bridge.
