Met at the Office of the County Clerk

All of the members and the County Clerk being present,
pursuant to adjournment.

Roads!

In the matter of a
Road Petitioned for by
Wm Messersheimer, Et al. }

On the 29th day of June 1891, a
road petition signed by Wm Messersheimer and 34 others
was filed and this day presented to the Board of County
Commissioners of Douglas County Kansas.

Praying for the Location and Vacation of certain road
described as follows, to wit..

Locate.

Beginning at the N.W. Cor of SE $\frac{1}{4}$ of Sec 24. T 14. R 18.
Thence South along $\frac{1}{2}$ Sec line as near as practicable
to Fair View. grain yard. Thence west $\frac{1}{2}$ R. Thence S 23 R.
Thence E $\frac{1}{2}$ R. to said $\frac{1}{2}$ Sec. line. Thence S along said line
to S.W. Cor of SE $\frac{1}{4}$ of said section to intersect a road
running East and West.

Vacate!

One mile of road running south commencing at
the N.W. Cor of Sec 24 T 14. R 18. Now being located along
west side of said Section, or to a point where it
intersects or crosses road running E & W.

Said petition was accompanied with a bond as required
by law signed by Wm Messersheimer, as principal, and
Henry Webber, W. D. Markle, J. L. Horner and R. A. Willis as
surety in the amount of all costs and expenses accruing on
said view.

Whereupon said bond was approved by the Board
and in appearing to the satisfaction of the Board that the
law had been substantially complied with, It was ordered
that E. F. Halderman, J. R. Woodward and E. H. Jack be
appointed viewers on the proposed road, and that they
meet in conjunction with the County Surveyor at the place
of beginning, on the day designated in their notice and
proceed to view and lay out said road according to
law giving to all parties a hearing and make due
report of their proceedings to the County Board.
