Road petitioned for by {

On the 10th day of July 1891, a road petitioned for by Aaron Miller and 30. others was filed and this day presented to the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County Kansas, praying for the "Location" of a certain road described as follows to wit,

Beginning at the NE Cor of SE 8th of Sec 5. T14 R19. Then due N on S line of Sections 5 and 6. T14. R19, about 1¹/₂ miles until same intersects road on S line of NE 8th Sec 6. T14 R19.

Then begin in center of County Road #220. where said road leave S line on each side of Sec 31. T13. R19. Then S on S line to center of road above prayed for, and Vacate. That part of old road not on section line.

Said petition was accompanied with a bond as required by law, signed by Aaron Miller as principal and J.M. Flory as surety in the sum of all expenses and costs accruing on said view.
