Road Dedication. { Clinton Kansas April 18<sup>th</sup> A.D. 1891.

For the consideration of ~~our~~ <sup>our</sup> dollars, We the undersigned land owners, do hereby dedicate to the County of Douglas, State of Kansas for a public highway, a strip of land fifteen feet wide on each of center line of Section No. 31, Town 13, Range No. 19, said County "to wit" begin at the South center corner of said Sec. 31, T 13, R 19. Thence North on half section line one mile to intersect a public road on the North line of said Sec. Signed, Joseph Hoover, Rudolph Hellstrom James Quigg, C. M. Gross and P. A. Dolber

The Board having the aforesaid Petition and Dedication under consideration, and believing it to be of public utility,

It was "Ordered" that the same be accepted and adopted.

The County Clerk is hereby authorized to place same under the County Road Record as Road No. ~~and~~ to notify the Trustee of Clinton township to cause the same to be opened for public travel in accordance therewith,

On the 2<sup>nd</sup> day of June 1891, a road petition was filed, signed by Chas Pilla and 38 others and this day presented to the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County Kansas, praying for the location of a certain road described as follows "to wit."

Beginning at a point on the section line road between Sec<sup>t</sup> 10 and 18, Town 13, Range 21, 80 rods west of the County line between Johnson and Douglas Counties. Running thence South on the line between Stader and Harris 80 rods. Thence East on the line between the same parties 40 rods. Thence diagonally in a South Easterly direction about 35 rods when it intersects the County line road between the counties above named.

Said petition was accompanied with a bond as required by law, signed by Chas Pilla as principal, Fred Koch and August Fierman as surety in the sum of all expenses and costs accruing on said view.
