

Lawrence Kansas Oct. 14th A.D. 1891.

The Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County Kansas met at the office of the County Clerk pursuant to Adj. All of the Members and the County Clerk being present

On the 14th day of Oct 1891. a road petition signed by John D. Weaver and 30 others was filed and this day presented to the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County Kansas praying for the Location and Vacation of a certain road described as follows, to wit.

"Locate" Beginning at the County line between Johnson and Douglas Counties in township 12. R. 21. Commencing at the half sec line of Sec 34 running West 80 R. 21st in a southwesterly direction 40 R. Keeping 150 feet south of the center of the track of the F. & D. R.R. Thence south 50 rods. Thence west 40 rods. Thence south 60 rods. Thence in a southwesterly course about 40 rods. Thence west about 100 rods where it intersects the County road running North & South, and to

"Vacate" All that portion of the road commencing at the County line between Douglas and Johnson Counties, running west and parallel to the F. & D. R.R. about 360 rods to where said road intersects the County road aforementioned as running north and South. The road asked to be vacated is on the south side of the F. & D. R.R.

Said petition was accompanied with a bond as required by law signed by John D. Weaver as principal and C. H. Hill as surety in the amount of all costs and expenses accruing on the view, survey, and laying out of said road in case the prayer of said petitioners shall not be granted &c. Whereupon said bond was approved by the Board, and it appearing to the satisfaction of the Board that the law had been substantially complied with. It was "Ordered" that John Gilmore, Jennings and Thomas Rayson, be appointed viewers on the proposed road, and that they meet in conjunction with the County surveyor at the place of beginning, on the day designated in their notice and proceed to view and lay out said road according to law giving to all parties a hearing and make due report of their proceedings to the (Page 351)
