Road Petitioned for by
F. C. Taughn et al.

On the 6th day of Jan. A.D. 1892 a Road Petition signed by F. C. Taughn and 14 others was filed and this day presented to the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County Kansas. Praying for the "Location" of a certain road described as follows:

Commencing where the Eudora or Coal Creek road (running west) strikes the $\frac{1}{2}$ Sec line (running N. & S.) of Sec. 34, T. 14, R. 20. Thence S. on or near said line to the lane separating the property of King and Taughn, near the middle of said Sec. Thence West through said lane (about 84 R.) to middle of that portion of Main Street remaining unvacated of Old Palmyra townsite "vacated"

Said Petition was accompanied with a bond as required by law signed by F. C. Taughn, W. H. D. Barricklow as surety in the sum of all costs and expenses accruing on said view. Whereupon said bond was approved by the Board, and it appearing to the satisfaction of the Board that the law had been substantially complied with, It was ordered that Peter Weeks, F. B. Tarnum and Emerald Jones, be appointed viewers on the proposed road, and that they meet in conjunction with the County Surveyor at the place of beginning, on the day designated in their notice and proceed to view and lay out said road according to law, giving to all parties a hearing, and make due report of their proceedings to the County Board.
