In the matter of a road
petitioned for by
Henry Webber et al

The aforesaid petition of Henry Webber as recorded in Comm. Record "F" pages 317 & 318. being under consideration, the following action thereon was taken by the Board, to-wit:

Upon due consideration, no legal objections having been offered against the establishment of said road hereinafter mentioned, and believing the same to be of public utility. It is ordered that the viewers report of view, and report of plat and survey be adopted, as follows:

Commence at the corner stone, being the North East corner of South East $\frac{1}{4}$ of Sec 15 Township 14 South, Range 18 East of 6th Principal Meridian, thence on $\frac{1}{4}$ Sec line N 81° 35' E (magnetic meridian) 1320 feet, let stone from which Hickory tree 6 inches dia, bears N 30° 5' E 17 $\frac{1}{2}$ ft, and an Elm tree 8 inches dia bears N 78° 35' W 23 $\frac{1}{2}$ ft, said road to be 30 feet wide, namely 10 feet North of said line as surveyed and 20 feet South of said line, and that said road be declared located and established as a public highway in accordance therewith, full record thereof to be made in the County Road Record and Plat as Road No. 475 and the Trustee of Marion Township be notified to cause the same to be opened for the public travel 30 feet wide.

Election of Chairman.

The hour of noon having arrived Mr. B. F. Hoskinson took the oath of office as County Commissioner 2nd Comm^{rs} District.

On motion of H. B. Asker the Board proceeded to the election by ballot of Chairman for the ensuing year, which resulted in the election of Mr. J. C. Moore as Chairman.

Resolution.

The following resolution was introduced by H. B. Asker and on motion adopted.

Resolved: That in the retirement of John Walton as a Commissioner of this County, after fifteen years continuous service, the County has lost the services of a faithful, conscientious and capable official, one who has always carefully guarded the interests of the people.

That this resolution be spread upon the records of the County.
