

Lawrence, Kansas, July 17th 1892.

The Board met in special session. Present, Commissioners, J. C. Moore, Chairman, H. B. Adler and B. F. Hookinson, and the Clerk, J. S. Brooks.

Too Petition

A Tax Petition was received from W. A. Churchill asking to be allowed to redeem the W 2nd, E 5th, N 24th, & W 1st Sec 5-7-18-20 from the sale of 1880 with subsequent endorsements in payment of original sale & endorsements without interest. On motion the petition was granted.

Bridge at Patten Crossing.

The Board having under consideration the location of a bridge to be built ^{across the Lawrence creek} either at the Barber crossing in Clinton Tp. or at the Patten crossing in Kanawaka Tp. it was moved that a ballot be taken, which motion having been carried, a vote was taken which resulted in the selection of the Patten crossing by the following vote: - Patten crossing, 2. Barber crossing, 1.

The Board instructed the Clerk to advertise for proposals for building said bridge. Bids to be opened March 15th 1892 - at 12 o'clock noon, with the right to reject any and all bids.

Said bridge to be constructed with one iron or steel span of 125 feet in length on cylinder piers 33 feet above the bed of the stream, 14 feet clear roadway and 75 feet of grade truck approach, 15 feet between vents in accordance with plans & specifications in the Clerk's office, or with such modifications as may be approved by the Commissioners.

Fine of Jno. Alexander, remitted.

On motion the Board remitted the fine of \$100 against John Alexander who had been confined in the County Jail on a charge of Petit Larceny. Said Alexander having been delivered to the Sheriff of Knox Co Mo. upon an order of the Governor of Kansas.

Petition of C. B. Busse.

A Petition signed by 100 citizens of Douglas County, asking for a remittance of the fine of \$100 - costs against C. B. Busse, for a violation of the Prohibitory law, was presented, and on motion granted.
