Road.

In the matter of a
Road petition for }
J.C. Barriellow et al

On the 31st day of March A.D. 1891, a Road petition signed by J.C. Barriellow and 40 others was filed, and on this day presented to the Board of County Commissioners, praying for the location of a certain road described as follows: Beginning 1/4 Rods West of the N.E. corner of the N.W. 1/4 Section 34, Township 14, Range 20, where the old Lawrence road intersects the section line between sections 27 and 34, thence running in a North West by direction down the ridge to the crossing of Main and 1st Street in the old Polynge Farm site, that being the best road bel near by in a wet time, and is demanded for the public good.

Said petition was accompanied with a bond as required by law, signed by J.C. Barriellow as Principal, and D. Harshbarger, Geo. Combs, Geo. Jenkins and D. F. Frye as sureties, in the sum of all costs and expenses accruing on said view. Whereupon said bond was approved by the Board, and it appearing that the law had been complied with, it was ordered, that Henry Landrum, J. D. Butterick and A. J. Woods be appointed viewers on the proposed road, and that they meet in conjunction with the County Surveyor at the place of beginning, on the day designated in their notice, and proceed to view and locate said road according to law, giving to all parties a hearing, and make due report of their proceedings to the County Board.

County Printing

Commissioner Haslam introduced the following resolution: Resolved That the Lawrence Journal be and the said paper is hereby named and designated the official paper of Douglas County. In the ensuing year. All the County officers are hereby instructed to have all printing over which this Board has control, done by said paper. On motion the resolution was adopted by a unanimous vote.

The Board appointed H. Davis of Eudora Tp. and W. Miller of Wabasha Tp. to assist the Probate Judge as Treasury Examiners.
