Road

In the matter of a
Road petition for }
W. Postma et al }

The aforesaid petition of W. Postma as recorded in C.R. 2, page 353, being under consideration, the following action was taken by the Board:

Upon due consideration, no legal objections having been offered against the establishment of said road hereinafter mentioned, and believing the same to be of public utility.

It is ordered that the viewers report of view and report and plat of survey be adopted, as follows:

Beginning 1323 feet South of & of the North East corner of the North East quarter of section No. 9, Township No. 14, Range No. 18, thence South 81° West 1320 feet, thence South 9° E 1293 feet to intersect road No. 3, 3 feet wide 400 feet, then 40 feet wide to end.

^{and} Vacate. Beginning 1323 feet South of the NE corner of the SE 1/4 of section No. 9, Township 14, Range 18, thence South about 80 rods, thence West 80 rods.

and that said road be located and established as a public highway in accordance therewith.

Also, that the above vacation be declared granted, full record thereof to be made in the County Road Record and Plat as Road No. 579 and the Trustee of Marion Township be notified to cause the same to be opened for the public travel.
