Road.

In the matter of a
road petitioned for by
J. J. Bures and 22 others

On the 27th day of June A.D. 1892, a Road
Petition signed by J. J. Bures and 22 others was filed and this day
presented to the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kans.
praying for the location of a certain road described as follows:

Beginning at the centre of section No 36 Township 11 Range 17.
at a point of termination of a North and South road, running thence North
along the West side of the East line of the town site of Grover for a distance
of about 100 rods, and across a bridge over Spring Creek at the inter-
section of an unnamed street, thence in a North westerly direction to the
intersection of the County road along the Right of way of the A.T. & P. R.R.

Said petition was accompanied with a bond as required by law
signed by John J. Bures as Principal and W. H. Christian as surety in
the amount of all costs and expenses accruing on the view, survey and
laying out of said road in case the prayer of the petitioners shall not
be granted.

Whereupon said bond was approved by the Board, and it appearing
that the law had been substantially complied with, it was ordered,
that W^m Draper, Osgood Coleman and M. B. Ray be appointed viewers
on said road, and that they meet in conjunction with the County Surveyor
at the place of beginning, on the day designated in their notice, and
proceed to view and lay out said road according to law, giving to all
parties a hearing and make due report of their proceedings to the
County Board.
