Road.

In the matter of a
Road petitioned for by
J.J. Bruce, et al.

On the 27th day of June A.D. 1892, a Road Petition signed by J.J. Bruce and others was filed and this day presented to the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, praying for the location of a certain road described as follows:

Beginning at the centre of section No. 31 Township 11 Range 17, at a point of termination of a North and South road, running true North along the West side of the East line of the town site of Grover for a distance of about 100 rods, and across a bridge over Spring Creek at the intersection of an unnamed street, thence in a North-westerly direction to the intersection of the County road along the right-of-way of the Atch. & T. R. R.

Said petition was accompanied with a bond as required by law, signed by John J. Bruce as Principal and W.H. Christian as surety in the amount of all costs and expenses occurring on the view, survey and laying out of said road in case the prayer of the petitioner shall not be granted etc.

Whereupon said bond was approved by the Board, and it appearing that the law had been substantially complied with, it was ordered that W^m Draper, Osgood Coleman and Mr. Ray be appointed viewers on said road, and that they meet in conjunction with the County Surveyor at the place of beginning, on the day designated in his notice, and proceed to view and lay out said road according to law, giving to all parties a hearing and make due report of their proceedings to the County Board.
