Road

On the 7th day of July A. D. 1892, a road petition signed by M. B. Ray et al 22 others was filed and this day presented to the Board praying for the location and vacation of a certain road described as follows. To wit: Beginning at or near the section line between sections 13 & 15 Township 13, Range line between 18 and 19 on North side of R.R. thence running in a westerly direction along right of way of R.R. to a point near R.R. bridge on Wakarusa river, thence in a North westerly direction along the North bank of said Wakarusa river to the Ray fork in N.E. Sec 14, T. 13, R. 18. thence South westerly across said river to the R.R. thence westerly along R.R. to Clinton station, thence across said R.R. thence westerly along right of way of R.R. to a point near R.R. bridge on Wakarusa river in S.W. Sec 10, T. 13, R. 18. thence westerly around bend of said river between river and bluff in the most practical route to intersect Road No 399, and to "Vacate" that part of road on the North side of R.R. on or near section line between sections 10 & 15, T. 13, R. 18.

Said petition was accompanied by a bond as required by law signed by M. B. Ray as principal and J. C. Mearns as surety in the amount of all costs and expenses accruing in said view, survey & laying out of said road, in case the prayer of the petitioners be not granted. Whereupon said bond was approved by the Board, and it appearing that the law had been substantially complied with, it was ordered, that B. Armstrong, Milton Winters and Lane Buckham be appointed viewers on the proposed road, and that they meet in conjunction with the County Surveyor at the place of beginning on the day designated in their notice and proceed to view and lay out said road according to law giving to all parties a hearing and make due report of their proceedings to the County Board.
