

Lawrence, Kansas, July 13th 1892.

The Board of County Commissioners met in the office of the County Clerk pursuant to adjournment.

Present: J.C. Moore, Chairman.

H.B. Adler and B.F. Haskins, and the County Clerk F.S. Brooks, Grant Jp. Dist.

On motion the Board reconsidered their action taken on July 8th setting July 30th as the day upon which a hearing was to have been given to the petitioners for a ditch in Grant Jp. and changed said date to August 12th 1892, at 10 o'clock, a.m. these proceedings were taken at the request of the petitioners.

Treasury Examiners. The Board appointed J.H. Bonebrake of Leamington Twp and John Dierckx of Kawwaka Twp. to assist the Probate Judge as Treasury Examiners for the present quarter.

Appropriation. The Board appropriated a sufficient sum out of the General Fund of Douglas County to pay all claims as allowed, by them at the July 1892 session, as shown by the County Commissioners Record of Allowances No. 3, from pages 61 to 72 inclusive.

The Board appropriated the sum of "100" out of the County General Fund towards the support of the Normal Institute.

**Appropriation for }
Patterson Bridge }**

The Board being in doubt as to the legality of their action at their session on Jan'y 12th 1892, in the appropriation of money to build bridge either at the Patton or Barker crossing over Wafarner creek, hereby reconsider the same, and appropriate the sum of "3,000" or as much thereof as may be necessary to build bridge at the Patton crossing in Lawrence Township.

Bridge Appropriations

The Board made the following appropriations for bridges and bridge repairs:

Repairs on Washington Creek bridge near Shephards = 175⁰⁰

" " Belvoir " " = 120⁰⁰

" " Bridge near Darnell's on Township line = 30⁰⁰

Building bridge on Lawrence and Clinton road on Township line between Wafarner & Clinton Townships the sum of "250⁰⁰"

Drainage at County Jail.

The Board authorized Comm^r Adler to look after additional drainage at the County Jail, and have any necessary repairs made.
