The Board of County Commissioners met pursuant to adjournment in the office of the County Clerk.

Present: J. C. Moore, Chairman.

H. B. Acker and B. F. Haslam, and the County Clerk T. D. Brooks.

Tax Levy.

Upon motion the following changes were made in the tax levies:

The Interest and Sinking fund of Clinton Tp was changed from 8 mills to 7 $\frac{1}{2}$ mills.

General fund levy of Leecompton - - - - - 3 - - - 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ -

General fund levy of Lawrence - - - - - 3 - - - 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ -

The levy for State Taxes was received from the State Auditor as follows: Amount called for = \$18,676.79.

Assessed valuation was increased 4% by the State Board of Equalization.

Rail Road property was unchanged, making the tax levy for State purposes on R.R. = 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ mills, to which is added $\frac{1}{2}$ of a mill to cover the 4% increase, making the levy =

Rail Roads = 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ mills

All other property = 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ -
