The Board of County Commissioners met pursuant to adjournment in the office of the County Clerk.

On the matter of a Road
Petitioned for by M. B. Ray
et al

On the 8th day of October 1892, a Road Petition signed by M. B. Ray and 15 others was filed and this day presented to the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, praying for the Location and Vacation of a certain road described as follows: "Beginning at or near the section line between sections 13 and 18, Township 13, on Range line between Sec 18 and 19, on North side of R.R. thence running in a westerly direction along R. of W. of R.R. to a point near R.R. bridge in Wakarusa river, thence in a N. Westerly direction along the North bank of said Wakarusa river to the log fork in N.E. 1/4 Sec. 14, T. 13, R. 18. thence N. Westerly across said river to R.R. thence Westerly along R.R. to Clinton Station, thence across said R.R. thence Westerly along R. of W. of R.R. to a point near R.R. bridge in Wakarusa river in S.W. 1/4 Sec. 10, T. 13, R. 18. thence S. Westerly around head of said river between river and bluff in the most practical route to intersect Road No. 399, and to

Vacate: that part of road on the North side of R.R. in or near section line between sections 13 and 15, T. 13, R. 18.

Said Petition was accompanied with a Bond as required by law, signed by M. B. Ray as principal and Geo. W. Ray as surety in the sum of all expenses and costs accruing on said river.

Whereupon said Board was approved by the Board, and it appearing to the Board that the law had been substantially complied with. It was ordered that B. Armstrong, M. W. Winters Jr. and Sam Bushkin be appointed viewers on the proposed road, and that they meet in conjunction with the Collector at the place of beginning, on the day designated in this notice and proceed to view and lay out said road according to law, giving to all parties a hearing and make due report of their proceedings to the Board.
