banks are suitable to build a bridge across said creek, and from the lower bank of said creek, run first in a N. E. & S. E. direction to said road as now located, and to locate old road between said points of beginning and ending of said new road, also from said lower bank of creek, locate road in a N. W. & S. W. direction to intersect said N. E. & S. E. road as now located, and to locate said N. E. & S. E. road between points where said roads now cross each other and where last named location of road ends. The above location to be made when bridge and new roads are completed and opened for public use.

Said petition was accompanied with a bond as required by law signed by D. Mifflin as principal and James Brooks and J. P. Barker as sureties in the sum of all expenses and costs accruing on said view. Whereupon said bond was approved by the Board, and it appearing to the satisfaction of the Board that the law had been substantially complied with. It was ordered that J. C. Moore, G. W. Lee and Geo. W. DeLoach be appointed viewers on the proposed road, and that they meet in conjunction with the County Surveyor at the place of beginning on the day designated in their notice and proceed to view and lay out said road according to law, giving to all parties a hearing, and make due report of their proceedings to the County Board.

The Board on motion appropriated the sum of \$35⁰⁰ to send an inmate of the Poor Farm known as "Pearl Bell" to her home in the East.
