

The court further states: "That the meetings of the board of equalization to equalize the assessment of property, and to levy taxes, and to meet as a board of canvassers to canvass the election returns, are not included in section 13, and hence each member of the board is entitled to a compensation of \$3.00 per day while attending upon such services, over and above the compensation fixed in Sec. 13, to wit, \$100.

I am inclined to hold that when the board meet, and which meetings are fixed by law, which are for special purposes, and which meetings are not intended for the transaction of ordinary county business, each member of the board of county commissioners is entitled to a compensation of \$3.00 ^{per day in addition to the aforesaid \$100.00}. In reading this decision one would naturally think that the Supreme Court evidently intended at that time to limit the extra compensation of the board of county commissioners over the sum of \$100 to services performed by the board while meeting as a board of equalization, while meeting as a board to levy taxes, and as a board of canvassers to canvass election returns; but our Supreme Court has gone further in a later decision contained in 44th Kansas: returns, and for other In the case of State of Kansas vs. Corning, page 443. In this case the defendant Corning was charged in the third count of the indictment of having willfully and unlawfully obtained more money for his services than he was entitled by law so to do. The Supreme Court in passing upon this question, which opinion was rendered by Chief Justice Horton, that a member of the board of county commissioners was entitled to a compensation over and above the \$100 provided for in Sec. 13, for services while attending meetings to equalize assessments, to levy taxes, to canvass the returns of election, or other like service. What the Supreme Court means by the phrase "or other like service" I do not know, and as I take it, am not called upon at this time to explain.
