I presume, however, the Supreme Court means by that phrase those meetings which are fixed by law, and are for special purposes, and are not intended for the transaction of ordinary county business, and which are not included in the meetings designated in Sec. 13 or Par. 1623. Hence I conclude that the board of county commissioners are entitled to a compensation in this county as follows, to wit:

First. \$100 for the meetings of said board on the first Monday of January, and the first Monday after the first Tuesday of April, and the first Mondays of July and October in each year, and in special session on the call of the chairman, at the request of two members of the board, as often as the interest of the county may demand.

Second. Each member of the board is entitled to a compensation of \$8.00 a day for all meetings of said board which are fixed by law and are for special services, and are not intended for the transaction of ordinary county business; such as the meeting of the board as a board of equalization, as a board to levy taxes, and as a board of canvassers to canvass the election returns, and for other like services, in addition to the aforesaid \$100.00.
