

Lawrence, Jan. July 10th 1894.

The Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County met pursuant to adjournment in the office of the County Clerk.

Present: B. F. Hoskinson, Chairman.
M. S. Winter and D. T. Hughes and the County Clerk.

On motion the Board authorized the County Treasurer to receive the taxes of 1894 on $N^{\frac{1}{2}}$ of $N^{\frac{1}{2}}$ Sec 19, 20, 19, and $SW^{\frac{1}{4}}$ Sec 19, 20, 19, without penalty.

In the matter of a road petitioned for by J. J. Tobler et al

The aforesaid petition of J. J. Tobler et al as recorded in Commis Rec "F" page 593, being under consideration, the following action thereon was held by the Board of County Commissioners: Upon due consideration no legal objections having been offered against the establishment of said road hereinafter mentioned, and believing the same to be of public utility, it is ordered that the Viewers report of View and report and plat of survey be adopted as follows: "Begin at the NW cor of Sec 29, T. 13, R. 19, thence Var $7^{\circ} 43'$ South on Sec line between Secs 29 & 30, 40.00 chs. the $\frac{1}{2}$ cor between Secs 29 & 30, 80.00 chs. the cor to Secs 29, 30, 31 & 32," and that said road be declared located and established as a public highway in accordance therewith. Full record thereof to be made in the County Road Record and plat as Road No. - and the Trustees of Clinton Township be notified to cause the same to be opened for the public travel. The $N^{\frac{1}{2}}$ to be 40 feet wide, the $S^{\frac{1}{2}}$ 33 feet wide. Damages allowed: Mrs V. C. Wright "50", M. & Bond "35"

On motion the Board appointed L. E. Hecox as overseer of building of Mifflin bridge.

The Board examined and allowed claims against the County and
