

Lawrence, Kansas. July 10th 1895.

The Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County met
pursuant to adjournment in the office of the County Clerk.
Present: Mr. S. Winter, Chairman.

Adjournments to bridge }
The Board on motion instructed the County Clerk to
advertise for sealed proposals for building stone abutments for
bridge at crossing of Little Salina creek on North line of Sec 32,
T. 3. R. 21, E. 2nd Twp. as per plans and specifications on file
in this office. Bids to be opened Aug 5th 1895 at noon.

The Board on motion instructed the Clerk to advertise for
sealed bids for building two cribs and filling same with rock,
and building about 1100 cubic feet dry masonry wall, &
excavating about 150 cubic yards, all where Coon creek crosses
Sec 3, T. 12. R. 18, Leampt. Twp. as per plans and specifications
on file in this office. Bids to be opened Aug 5th 1895 at noon.

In the matter of a Road petitioned }
for by Henry Bell et al }

On the 8th day of July 1895, a Road Petition
signed by Henry Bell and 36 others was filed and this day presented
to the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, praying for
the widening of a certain road as follows: To wit: Begin at a point
at NWth of NWth Sec 12, T. 15. R. 20, thence S. 1 mile to a point at the NEth
of NEth Sec 12, T. 15. R. 20. Said petition was accompanied by a
bond according to law signed by Henry Bell as principal and a diff-
erent as sureties in the sum of all expenses and cost accruing
in said road, ^{whereupon said bond was approved by the Board} and it appearing to the satisfaction of the Board
that the law had been substantially complied with, it was ordered
that J. C. Barton, J. E. Waller and J. T. Foye be appointed viewers on the
proposed road, and that they meet in conjunction with the County
Surveyor at the place of beginning on the day designated in
their notice and proceed to view said road according to law,
giving to all parties a hearing and make due report of their
proceedings to the County Board.

In the matter of a Road petitioned }
for by E. W. Melville et al }

On the 2nd day of July 1895, a Road Petition
signed by E. W. Melville and 28 others was filed and this day presented
to the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, praying for
the opening of a certain road described as follows: To wit: Beginning
at the NE corner of Sec 19, T. 13. R. 21, & running 1 mile South to NEth
of said Sec. Said petition was accompanied with a bond as required
by law signed by E. W. Melville as ^{principal} and A. Shellack as ^{surety}.
