

Lawrence, Kans. Oct 15th (Cont)

Said Petition was accompanied with a bond as required by law signed by B. L. Pickett as principal and J. H. Dill and J. T. Johnson as sureties in the sum of all costs and expenses accruing on said Petition. Whereupon said bond was approved by the Board and it appearing to the satisfaction of the Board that the law had been substantially complied with. It was ordered that H. D. Whitman, Geo. T. Hume and W. D. Dwyer be appointed Viewers on the proposed road, and that they meet in conjunction with the County Surveyor at the place of beginning on the day designated in their notice and proceed to view and lay out said road according to law giving to all parties a hearing and make due report of their proceedings to the County Board.

In the matter of a road petition

On the 15th day of Oct 1895 a Road Petition signed by Fred Sulgen and 27 others was filed and this day presented to the Board of County Commis of Douglas County, Kas. praying for the Location and Vacation of a certain road described as follows. To wit: Begin on E line of R & E Sec 33, T. 11. N. R. where road No 134 intersects same, thence running due West on sec line about 1/2 mile to a place where said road 134 again intersects said E line of Sec 33. also vacate all that portion of Road No 134 lying in Sec 32 T. 11. N. R. Said petition was accompanied with a bond as required by law signed by L. B. Cunningham and B. T. Glenn as sureties in the sum of all expenses and costs accruing on said Petition and it appearing to the satisfaction of the Board that the law had been substantially complied with. It was ordered that W. Stone, H. B. Rogers and W. McYoung be appointed Viewers on the proposed road, and that they meet in conjunction with the County Surveyor at the place of beginning, on the day designated in their notice and proceed to view and lay out said road according to law giving to all parties a hearing and make due report of their proceedings to the County Board.
