Bridge Contract } The following contract & agreement by & between the Board of County  
Contractors of Douglas County 1900. & J. J. Cox of Lawrence 1900.  
Witnesseth: That said J. J. Cox agrees to furnish all material & put in place two stone  
retaining walls 20 feet long at the north end of what is known as the Blue  
Mound Bridge & two at the south end 15 feet long out of noble masonry  
said walls to be 2  $\frac{1}{2}$  feet thick at the bottom & 15 inches at the top. & also to  
make fill at the north & south ends of said bridge to grade from bridge to road. & to furnish &  
place an 18 foot bridge out of old material across what is known as the P. C. Johnston ditch, and to  
cause to rest on stone walls. The above said J. J. Cox is to tear down the old  
approaches & have said material contained therein for the sum of \$350.00
