

Lawrence Kansas August 9<sup>th</sup> 1902

The Honorable Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County Kansas met in adjourned regular session. The following members were present J. O. Watts A. J. Parnell B. H. Haskins and Co. Clerk Geo. H. Flory

Resolution in the Matter Architects

On motion of Mr Parnell and seconded by Mr Haskins the following resolution was adopted. Whereas certain Articles of Association between Captain J. G. Haskell and Frederick C. Gunn, Architects, have been examined and approved by the Board of County Commissioners.

Now it is ordered that said Captain J. G. Haskell and Frederick C. Gunn, as associated Architects, are hereby retained and employed to furnish Architectural Services according to the Code of Ethics of the American Institute of Architects, the gross fees to be paid for said services not to exceed five per centum (5%) of the total gross cost of improvements.

And where as the Board of County Commissioners have examined the plans of Middagh and Mitchell, and G. E. McDonald, and finding certain points of merit in each, they will tender to Middagh and Mitchell the sum of One hundred Dollars (\$100<sup>00</sup>) and to G. E. McDonald the sum of Fifty Dollars (\$50<sup>00</sup>) for the use of said plans for a time as hereafter determined by the Board of County Commissioners after which time these plans will be returned to the Owners respectively.

In the Matter of the S. Phillips Road

On presentation of a petition signed by S. Phillips and others praying for the location and establishment of a certain road described as follows. Begin at the South West Corner of Sec 9. 13. N. and extending thence North along said section line to Street No. 12 in the City of Euclid, Douglas County Kansas. It was found that a good and sufficient Bond had been filed, where upon the following Viewers were appointed to meet in conjunction with the County Surveyor on the 6<sup>th</sup> day of October A.D. 1902 at the place of beginning of above described proposed road. Viewers, E. H. Hestenberg, John Ott, and J. P. Kendall.
