Geo. W. Savage offers to construct drain according to plans and specifications on file, Tile Drain 3300 ft. of 15 in. Drain for  $3393\frac{1}{2}$ , for Rubble stone work 18¢ sq. ft. for Rip-Rap work .08¢ sq. ft. for post & wire  $12\frac{1}{2}$ . for excavation in connection with stone work 30¢ per cu. yd. for back-water valve of iron 16 in. internal diameter  $\frac{1}{2}$  in thick 2 ft. long with leveled end and hinged door  $20\frac{1}{2}$ . Same as above with wood body  $5\frac{1}{2}$ . Check enclosed  $100\frac{1}{2}$

Tile Drain  $3460\frac{1}{2}$  for Rubble stone work 20¢ per cu. ft. for Rip-Rap 10¢ per sq. ft., for post & wire  $15\frac{1}{2}$ ; for excavation for stone work 28¢ per cu. yd. for back-water valve of cast iron  $25\frac{1}{2}$  if sewer pipe  $5\frac{1}{2}$ , if concrete cement  $10\frac{1}{2}$ .
