

The face to be double $\frac{7}{8}$ " matched flooring bone dry and driven together in paint with both sets of boards painted between to be smooth and put together with screws as directed by the archt. warranted solid and water-tight.

Lumber best bone dry clear white pine and the whole face calked and set in place with a body of Slater's Cement warranted not to give or start.

The two layers of boards to stand at right angles with each.

Middle of each face furnished with suitable sized door through which to place the hands which shall be water-tight and such size as directed.

Edges next to stone work finished with quarter round moulding in paint or Slater's Cement warranted water-tight.

Interior painted with one coat mineral paint and exterior three coats lead and oil white with black letters, figures and strips as shown on plans.

The whole job complete and workmanlike in every particular.

The faces secured in place with four inch wood screws as directed and warranted secure.

All for the sum of One-hundred and ten ("110") dollars.
