Oct. 2, 1905. Board of County Commissioners met in regular session. Gus H. Brune, J.C. Walton, A.C. Neller & County Clerk were present.

In the matter of L.H. Petefish road the Board accepted the report of viewers which recommended the location and vacation of roads as follows:
 Locate:- Beginning on W. line of Sec. 7-13-19 at a point 2100 ft. S. of N.W. cor. of said Sec. 7, thence S. 26° 30' E. 84 ft., thence S. 88° 14' E. 45 ft., thence S. 43° 15' E. 356 ft., thence S. 21° E. 220 ft. to a point in the county road on the S. line of N.W. 4 of Sec. 7-13-19, amount of land taken 156 $\frac{1}{2}$ sq. rd.. Vacate:- that portion of the road on the S. line of N.W. 4 of Sec. 7-13-19 extending W. from the point of intersection of the above described road. As to damages claimed, ~~the~~ Albert J. Alexander claims damage amounting to $\$120.00$. We recommend that he be allowed $\$75.00$.

On motion the Board declared the above road located and established as a public highway and instructed the clerk to notify the trustee of the action. Board also authorized the chairman of Board and County clerk to issue scrip to Albert J. Alexander to the amount of $\$75.00$ (seventy-five) as above damages.

The following proposition was presented to the County Board:-

*Sidewalk
Proposed*

I propose to build the sidewalks around the Douglas County Court house such widths as you may desire for the sum of eighteen cents per sq. ft. The walks to be four inches in thickness on eight inch cinder foundation, and on grade furnished by the city engineer. Said walk will be built of Joplin Flint 4 parts, sand 2 parts, and cement (Portland, Iola) one part. The top of said walk to be composed of one part sand and one part cement, properly towed to a smooth surface and finished in a good and workmanlike manner to the satisfaction of the Board of County Commissioners. Signed, Geo. Ecker.

The above proposition was accepted.

Bills were allowed as per Allowance Record.
