Jan. 20, 1906. Board of County Commissioners met in adjourned session with J. C. Walton, A. C. Walter, Geo. H. Brune & the county Clerk present.

The release of John Ballard & Geo. Ady having been recommended by the executive committee of the temperance committee of 30 appointed last Fall (Prof. Corruth, Alex Mitchell, W. H. L. Raymond) and Judge Smart, Judge Riling & the County Attorney, on account of their inability to raise the money to pay their fines & costs, the Board ordered the fines & costs (not yet worked out) against said Ballard & Ady, to be omitted, the release of said men, and instructed the clerk to so notify the Sheriff. The release of said men is upon the condition that they engage no more in the sale of intoxicants.

On motion the Board appropriated six hundred (600) dollars toward the grading of the hill commonly known as the "Wind-Mill Hill" just West of Lawrence. Said money due upon the completion of the work to the satisfaction of the County Board, and according to the plans presented by Prof. Hoad.
