

On motion the Chairman of the Board was instructed & authorized to sign contracts with the Mo. & Kan. Telephone Company for the following offices: County Jail, Clerk of Court, County Treasurer, County Attorney, Probate Judge, Register of Deeds, Poor Commissioner, County Physician, County Clerk, County Superintendent, Deputy Sheriff, each of these contracts shall be for three years, beginning Jan. 1, 1906 & ending Jan. 1, 1909. Also for County Judge's office for one year, beginning Jan. 1, 1906, since that office is to be discontinued at the expiration of that time. The regular rate for each per month is three $\frac{50}{100}$ dollars, but the company makes concessions to the county on account of company crossing county bridges, thereby charging the county but one $\frac{50}{100}$ dollars per month each, or eighteen dollars per year for each phone.
