The Board of County Commissioners met in adjourned regular session. J. C. Hallon, A. C. Walter, Gus H. Boone & County clerk were present.

Bills

Claims against the county were examined and allowed as per allowance record.

The Board ordered the following notice to be printed in the Lawrence Journal, the Lawrence World & the Gazette:—

Whereas: Chapter 359 of the laws of 1895 provides for the destruction of Russian & Canada Thistle at such time as the Board of County Commissioners may direct upon notice published in one or more County papers for a time not less than three weeks before the time fixed upon for the destruction of said noxious weeds.

It is therefore ordered by the said Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, that all Russian Thistle & Canada Thistle be destroyed by every person and every corporation on all lands which he or it may own or occupy in Douglas County, Kansas, on or before the 4th day of August, 1906. And that every overseer of highways of every township in said county, shall also, at or after said date above mentioned, in like manner destroy all noxious weeds, either upon the highway of his road district, rail road right-of-way, or any unoccupied land therein, upon which the owner or lessee thereof shall neglect or refuse so to do.

It is further ordered that notice thereof be published in the official County paper for a time not less than three weeks before said 4th day of August, 1906.
