Whereas, Chapter 165 of the Session Laws of 1905, authorizes and requires the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, at the general election to be held in November, 1906, to submit to the qualified voters of Douglas County, the question as to whether or not the county shall build a jail and jailer's residence in accordance with the provisions of said act; And Whereas, Chapter 397 of the Session Laws of 1905 is applicable to Douglas County, Kansas, and relates to High Schools in cities under 16000 population, and Whereas, said chapter 397, provided that it shall not be in force in any county until its provisions are adopted by a majority vote of the electors therein, and requires that said proposition be submitted at the next general election, Now therefore,

Be it resolved by the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas,

That the County Clerk be, and he is hereby directed to have printed the necessary ballots to submit said propositions to the voters at the general election to be held on the 6th day of November, 1906.
