Mo. Valley Bridge
and Iron Works

On motion the Board appropriated the following amounts for the payment of the balance due the "Missouri Valley Bridge and Iron Works" on the side-walk & extra work on the "Fill", the Lawrence Bridge, & the Eudora Wakarusa river Bridge:— For the payment of the Principal \$7480⁷³/₁₀₀ seventy four hundred eighty ⁷³/₁₀₀ dollars; for payment of the Interest, eight hundred seventy six ⁷⁵/₁₀₀ dollars (\$876⁷⁵/₁₀₀). The Board instructed Chairman & clerk to issue Warrants for the above amounts in favor of the "Mo. Valley Bridge and Iron Works" as Balance due said company.

Road.

In the matter of J. P. Cummings Road as petitioned for Nov. 10, 1906, and viewed Dec. 14, 1906, the Board accepted the report of the viewers. The viewers recommended that the road be located according to the Field Notes of the Surveyor, & that it be established and opened forty feet wide. No damages were asked for. The Field Notes are:
