Redemption
Proposition.

Wm. E. Johnson tendered the Board a proposition to pay the sum of fifteen $\frac{1}{100}$ dollars, being the original amount of tax on certificate #161 sale of 1886 and #125 sale of 1885, County sale records, on N. 34 $\frac{1}{2}$ of E. 2 of S. E. 4 of Sec. 7-14-19, being for the tax of 1885 on the S. 1/2 of said tract and tax of 1884 and 1885 endorsed on the N. 1/2 of said tract, and cost of redemption.
