Now comes John H. Kelsey, one of the above named defendants, by John D. A. Norton, his attorney, and shows to the Honorable Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas:—

John H. Kelsey. That on the 21st day of Nov., 1905, at the November term of District Court, for said County of Douglas, the defendant, William Callahan, was convicted under the prohibitory law of selling whiskey on one count, and on another count of maintaining a nuisance, and was adjudged by said Court to pay the sum of \$200.00 and to be confined in the Douglas County jail one hundred & twenty days, and to pay the costs of the prosecution.

That the said defendant, William Callahan, appealed from the determination and judgement of the said Court to the Supreme Court of the State of Kansas. That on the 7th day of Nov., 1905, said defendant, Callahan, gave bond in said appeal in the sum of \$500.00; which bond was signed by the defendant, John H. Kelsey, and the defendant, W.C. Miller.

That the said appeal in said Supreme Court was dismissed, and that a mandate to that effect was filed with this Court on the 1st day of April, 1906.

That the said William Callahan failed to comply with the conditions and obligations of the said bond, and failed to surrender himself to the sheriff of Douglas County.

That an action entitled as above set out was brought against this defendant, John H. Kelsey, and the defendant W.C. Miller, and that on or about the — day of —, 1907, judgement was obtained thereon against this defendant, John H. Kelsey, and the defendant W.C. Miller, for the sum of \$500.00 and costs of the action. That the said defendant, Kelsey, is unable to pay the same. That the cost of in the case of the State vs. William Callahan, for the sale of intoxicating liquor amounts to the sum of \$101.10; that the costs in this civil action against this
