In the matter of James E. Hobbs road as petitioned for April 10, 1907, I viewed May 28, 1907, the Board accepted the report of the viewers. The viewers recommended that the road be located according to the "Field Notes" of the county surveyor, and that it be established, and opened thirty (30) feet wide. The surveyor's field notes are:-

Beginning at the '8 cor. on the East line of the South East 1/4 of Sec. 2 - T. 14 - R. 18. Thence West 15 ft., thence South parallel to section line to Washington Creek, thence East thirty feet, thence South parallel to section line to a point 15 feet East of the South East corner of said Sec. 2 - T. 14 - R. 18. On motion the Board declared the above road established as a public highway, and instructed the clerk to so notify the trustee of Marion Township. The viewers also recommended that John E. North be allowed thirty dollars damage, and H. N. Boles be allowed twenty five dollars damage, and instructed the clerk and chairman to issue warrants to said parties for said amounts.

In the matter of the Chat Pilla Road as petitioned for on May 7, 1907, and viewed on May 31, 1907, the Board accepted the report of the viewers. The viewers recommended that the road be located according to the "Field Notes" of the County Surveyor, and that it be established forty feet wide.

The Surveyor's "Field Notes" are - Beginning at the south end of the Kansas River bridge in S. Street of the City of Eudora, thence N. 45° 30' E. along the center line of Kansas River bridge 425 ft. to a point on said bridge in the center of road. thence S. 45° E. 700 ft. Also from the above mentioned point: thence N. 45° W. 400 ft., thence N. 78° W. 200 ft., thence N. 23° W. 90 ft. to water line. On motion the Board declared the above road established, as a public highway and instructed the clerk to so notify the trustee of Eudora Township.
