West quarter of the North West quarter of said Section 7; thence North to the North East corner of the North West quarter of North West quarter of said Section 7; thence East to the place of beginning in Douglas County, Kansas, should be added to said city, and that it will be to the interest of said city, and will cause no manifest injury to the persons owning real estate in said territory, to be added.
