The Board of County Commissioners met in adjourned session. There were present Gus H. Boone, J. C. Walton & the County Clerk.

The following "Notice to Contractors" was ordered printed in the Official Papers: Notice is hereby given that sealed proposals will be received by the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, at the office of the County Clerk in the Court House in the City of Lawrence until 12 o'clock M. of Thursday the 30th day of July 1908, for the building of a County Jail & Sheriff's residence in said city of Lawrence according to plans & specifications now on file in the office of said County Clerk.

Contractors are invited to submit proposals for the building proper according to plans and specifications.

Separate bids will be received for the special jail work which includes cells, jail doors, window guards, locking devices, fireproofing, plumbing, heating, gasfitting, electric wiring, etc.

Only general plans for cell work have been adopted and bidders are at liberty to submit specifications with their proposals, but the same general conditions shall govern this special work as govern the building contract.

Contractors are at liberty to bid on all or any of the work as they may prefer and the contractor whose bid is accepted will be required to file bonds as required by law, to be approved by the Board of County Commissioners.

Each proposal must be accompanied by an unconditional certified check on some bank in the city of Lawrence, payable to the Treasurer of Douglas County, Kansas, in the amount as follows:— If the proposal be for all the work, then the amount of the check will be \$150⁰⁰. If for only part of the work, the amount of the check will be ten per cent of the amount of the bid for such part.

The checks of the unsuccessful bidders will be returned at the close of the letting.

The check of the successful bidder shall be forfeited to Douglas County if such bidder shall fail or refuse to enter into contract and file approved bonds within ten days, but if within this time he enters into contract and files such bond, then this check is to be immediately returned to him.

The plans & specifications above referred to are to be at all times in the possession of the County Clerk, and are not to leave said office until said contract is let.

Bidders will seal their proposals, address them to the Board of County Commissioners, and file them with the County Clerk by 12 o'clock M. of Thursday, the 30th day of July, 1908, as no bids after that time will be considered.

The Board reserves the right to reject any or all bids.
