Road Dedication The Board accepted the following Road Dedication: We the undersigned owners of the S.W. 1/4 of Sec. 25-T. 13-R. 17, do hereby dedicate to Douglas County for highway purposes the following described piece or parcel of land: A strip of land 20 feet wide on either side of the following described line: Beginning on the North line of the S.W. 1/4 of Sec. 25-T. 13-R. 17 at a point 20 feet east of the top of the East bank of Wakarusa, thence South 100 ft., all in Sec. 25-T. 13-R. 17,

Midland Drainage District Petition A petition signed by H. A. Spray and nine others was presented to the Board of County Commissioners praying that all the land and Territory hereinafter mentioned be incorporated into a Drainage District, To Wit: Beginning at the N.W. cor. of Section 2-T. 12-R. 19 East, thence South 1 1/2 miles to the center of the West line of Sec. 11; East one half mile to the center of Sec. 11; South 4 1/2 mi. ch; East 1 mile; North 2 1/2 mi. ch; East one half mile to East boundary line of Sec. 12; North on said boundary line of said Sec. 12 to the point where said boundary line intersects the North boundary line of the right-of-way of The Union Pacific Railway Company; Northwesterly along the said North boundary line of said right-of-way to the point where the said North boundary of said right-of-way intersects the North boundary line of Sec. 2-T. 12-R. 19 East; thence West one half mile to the point of beginning. Whereupon the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, agreed to hear said petition at the Court House on the 22 day of Oct. 1908, at 10 o'clock A. M. - The petitioners also asked that the above district be incorporated under the corporate name of "The Midland Drainage District of Douglas County, Kan."

A petition signed by A. A. Hicks and 15 others was presented to the Board of Commissioners praying that all the land and Territory hereinafter mentioned be incorporated into a Drainage District to be known as the O.K. Drainage District of Douglas County, Kansas, To Wit: Beginning at the N.E. cor. of Sec. 19-T. 12-R. 20;
