

stating that said petition was presented to the Mayor & Council of the City of Lawrence & that the prayer of petitioner was granted. And the Mayor & City Council recommended to the Board of County Commissioners that said petition to vacate be also granted.

The following action was taken by the Board of Co. Commissioners. Now on this 5th day of October, 1909, at the regular October session of the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, the petition of James E. Stubbs to vacate the streets and alleys on that portion of the east half of the north east quarter of the south east quarter of the south west quarter of section 36, Township 12, Range 27 east of the 6th P. M. Douglas County, Kansas, as shown in the recorded plat called University Heights, described as follows, to wit: Commence on the west line of the above described real property thirty feet south of the north west corner thereof; thence due south on said line 630.85 feet to the south west corner of the above described real property; thence due east on the south line of said real property 300.6 feet; thence due north thirty feet; thence due west parallel with the south line of said real property 300.6 feet to a point twenty feet east of the west line of the above described real property; thence from said point due north parallel with the west line of said property 600.85 feet to a point thirty feet south of the north line of the above described real property; thence due west twenty feet to the place of beginning, came on for hearing, and the Board, after listening to the testimony, and being fully advised in the premises, does find, First, That due notice of the above application to vacate the above described streets and alleys has been duly given by publication for four consecutive weeks in the Jeffersonian Gazette, a paper of general circulation in the City of Lawrence and Douglas County, and that due and legal notice has been given by publication as required by law.

Second, That no private rights will be injured or endangered by vacating the above described streets as herein set forth.

Third, That the general public will suffer no loss or inconvenience by reason of the vacation of said streets.

Fourth, That the Mayor and Council of the City of Lawrence, Kansas, have duly recommended that the petition of James E. Stubbs for the vacation of said streets and alleys be granted.

Fifth, That in justice to the petitioner, James E. Stubbs, the prayer of his petition should be granted.

It is therefore ordered, considered and adjudged that the prayer of the petitioner be granted and that the following streets are and the same are hereby forever vacated, to wit:— That portion of the streets and alleys of the east half of the north east
