

South, Range 19 East, thence North 80 rods, thence West $1\frac{1}{2}$ mile; thence North $\frac{3}{4}$ mile, thence West $\frac{3}{4}$ mile, thence South One and $\frac{1}{2}$ miles to the place of beginning: to constitute a public corporation and the inhabitants within such bounds are hereby incorporated as a Drainage District under the name of "The Wakarusa, Haskell and Eudora Drainage District of Douglas County, Kansas."

And it is further ordered by the Board that the time and place of holding the first election to choose officers for such Drainage District, be and the same are set and fixed as follows, to-wit: On the 27th day of November, 1909 between the hours of 8:00 A. M. and 6:00 P. M. at the County Farm situated within said Drainage District in said Douglas County, Kansas. And the following resident tax-payers of said Drainage District are hereby designated to act as judges and clerks at said election, to-wit: For judges: J. R. Shirer, Louis Howell and L. V. Reese. For clerks, H. F. Eggert, Charles S. Gaumer.

The County Clerk is hereby directed to cause notice of said election to be published in the official County paper.
