Now, Therefore, The condition of the foregoing obligation is such that if the said E. C. Karnes, the Principal, shall well, truly and faithfully comply with all the terms, covenants and conditions of said contract on his part to be kept and performed according to its tenor, then this obligation shall be null and void; otherwise to be and remain in full force and virtue in law.

Contract for Furnishing Coal. Copy.

This agreement entered into, this 5th day of September, 1913 by W. B. Gwin, party of the first part, and the board of county commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, party of the second part, witnesseth that the said W. B. Gwin, party of the first part, hereby contracts to and with said Board of county commissioners to furnish and deliver coal to the said Board of county commissioners, for the year beginning Sept. 2nd, 1913 as follows, to wit:

Best grade of Cherokee Lump coal, for Douglas County Court House and the Douglas County Jail, in Lawrence, at the rate of Four and $\frac{3}{100}$ Dollars (\$4.30) per Ton delivered at said Court House and Jail;

Best grade of Cherokee Lump coal, for pauper use, to be delivered to houses in the City of Lawrence as may be directed, in quantities of Four Hundred pounds (400) or Eight hundred pounds lots as may be ordered, from time to time, by the Douglas County Commissioner of the Poor, at the rate of Four and $\frac{6}{100}$ Dollars (\$4.60) per ton.

The coal for the Court House and Jail enough to be delivered by October 15, 1913 to fill the bins, in both buildings, and further deliveries for these places to be made whenever directed by the County Commissioners.
