The Board met in regular adjourned session with all members present.

Upon recommendation by the County Attorney, as follows:

"Board of County Commissioners
Lawrence, Kansas.

Gentlemen:

Harold F. Palis plead guilty to a charge of lewd and lascivious conduct and received a sentence of ninety days in jail and a fine of \$100.00. He served his jail sentence and worked out about one half his fine doing trusty work about the Court House. He is not a resident of Douglas County, and I rather feel like it is a loss to this county financially to keep him here longer since there are other prisoners in jail who are now eligible to work out their fine and for this reason I recommend that the remainder of this man's fine be remitted on the condition that he conduct himself properly, and does not violate any of the laws of the state of Kansas.
