Monday, January 12, 1914.

Board met in regular adjourned session with all members present.

Commissioner Brune went to Midland and conferred with the commissioners of Jefferson Co. regarding the repairing of Mud Creek Bridge on the Co. Line and made arrangements to repair said bridge, Jefferson Co. agreeing to pay one half of the cost.

J. F. Hoover was unanimously elected chairman of this Board for the coming year.

Arrangements were made with C. H. King to repair and paint the county line bridge across Mud Creek for the sum of \$20.00 said King agreeing to furnish the nails and haul the lumber necessary; the completed work to be subject to the approval of this Board.

Arrangements were also made with C. H. King to repair clean and paint the bridge known as Mud Creek Bridge, said King agreeing to haul the lumber, furnish nails, remove a tree that obstructs traffic across same, all for the sum of \$20.00, the completed work to be subject to the approval of this Board.

Board refunded taxes and authorized Co. Clerk to draw warrants to cover same as follows:-
