Board met in regular adjourned session with all members present.

The Board designated the Lawrence National Bank as a depository for county funds for one year, and accepted and approved their depository bond for \$50,000.00.

Mr. Theodore Gressa appeared before the Board and protested against the taking of dirt from the Leo road to fill in culvert at Bowman Bridge.

Monday, February 2, 1914.

Board met in regular session with all members present. Claims against the County were examined and allowed as per Allowance Record.

Commissioners Hoover and Brune inspected the work being done on fill at Bowman Bridge and reported work as progressing satisfactorily.

A petition signed by C. E. Wilson and 21 others for the location of a road, described as follows: "Beginning at the NW cor. of Sec. 25, T. 14, R. 18; thence E on Sec. line 80 rods more or less to intersect said road on said Sec. line. Also to vacate the road running around under the hill on N. side of said Section line", was presented to this Board and date for viewing same set for March 19, 1914 at place of beginning.

A petition signed by S. L. Cotton and 14 others for the location of a road described as follows: "Beginning at the NW cor. of Sec. 33, T. 14, R. 20; thence E one-half mile", was presented to this Board and date set for viewing same at March 16, 1914 at place of beginning.

The following banks were designated as depositories for the County funds for the coming year: - Watkins Hill Bank, Lawrence National Bank, Merchants Hill Bank, Peoples State Bank, Merchants Loan and Savings Bank, Citizens State Bank, and Farmers State and Savings Bank, all of the City of Lawrence; Peoples State Bank, and Baldwin State Bank, of Baldwin City; State Bank of Eudora and New Valley State Bank, of the City of Eudora; also State Bank of Tecumseh.

Board instructed the County Clerk to authorize the Sheriff to discharge Crim Higgins from his custody, said Crim Higgins having served his sentence and the costs of his prosecution having been remitted.
