Board met in regular adjourned session with all members present.

The resignation of A. M. Jordan as Treasurer of Willow Springs Township was accepted to take effect upon the qualification of his successor.

Mr. David Kessler was appointed Treasurer of Willow Springs Township to complete the unexpired term of office of A. M. Jordan, resigned.

In the matter of the road petitioned for by H. H. Hastie and others described on page 513, the proposition of said H. H. Hastie to pay the sum of \$50.00 into the County Treasury and furnish Bond as follows was accepted:— (Copy.)

Bond.

Know all Men By These Presents; That we, H. H. Hastie of Wakarusa Township in the County of Douglas and State of Kansas as principal and Elmer E. Brown, W. Eager, M. E. Kanner of Douglas County, Kansas, as sureties hereby bind ourselves to the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County in the State of Kansas in the sum of four hundred (\$400.00) dollars, to the payment of which, well and truly to be made, we hereby bind ourselves, our heirs, executors and administrators.

The condition of this obligation is such that whereas H. H. Hastie and more than 12 others have petitioned the Board of County Commissioners to view and lay out a road beginning at a point twenty (20) feet east of the center of the south side of section 15, township 13, range 19 and running north to Wakarusa Creek, said road to be 40 feet wide and whereas all the petitioners are householders in the County of Douglas in the State of Kansas and whereas L. S. Shepherd claims that he will be damaged \$400.00 by such road if it is laid as petitioned and whereas the Board of County Commissioners acting as viewers in this case have allowed the said L. S. Shepherd \$200.00 as damages for the said road being laid as petitioned and whereas the said principals and sureties in this undertaking have agreed by and with the Board of County Commissioners that they will hold the County of Douglas in the State of Kansas harmless for any judgment in excess of \$200.00, that may be recovered by the said L. S. Shepherd in a suit for damages occasioned by the said road being laid out as petitioned with the costs of said suit.

Not if the said principal and sureties in this undertaking shall well and truly perform the conditions of this bond and shall hold the County of Douglas
