Motion was seconded by Commissioner J. C. Helton and passed.

Resolution providing for a stated period of six days in each month for the purpose of acting on claims against the County; was taken under consideration and upon motion of Comm. J. C. Helton, seconded by Geo. H. Brune the matter was to be referred to a Committee consisting of the Commissioners of the 2nd and 3rd districts and the Co. Atty.
